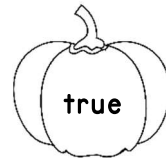

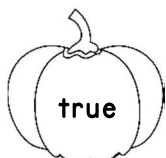
2 tens and 5 ones is equals to 52.



Jim says, "If you start from 0 and count in 2s, you will not say 35."

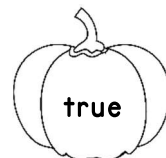


7 tens + 6 ones < 67

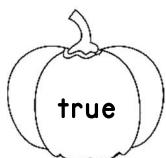


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Ben says, "I have underlined the tens."
